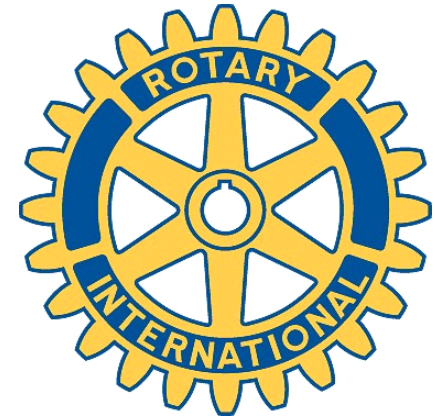
Directions:

The Object of Rotary

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

First The development of acquaintances, as an opportunity for service;

Second High ethical standards in business and professions, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations and the dignifying by each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

Third The application of the ideal of service by each Rotarian's personal, business and community life;

Fourth The advancement of international understanding, goodwill and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.



The Four-Way Test

The 4-Way Test is a simple but profound statement of things we think, say or do:

1. Is it the **TRUTH**?
2. Is it **FAIR** to all concerned?
3. Will it build **GOODWILL** and **BETTER FRIENDSHIPS**?
4. Will it be **BENEFICIAL** to all concerned?



Rotary membership offers a number of benefits, including the opportunity to:

- Bring about positive change within one's community.
- Develop leadership skills
- Gain an understanding of – and have an impact on – international humanitarian issues.
- Develop relationships with community and business leaders.

And membership also carries with it responsibilities, including:

- Attendance at weekly club meetings.
 - * *Opportunities to make-up attendance include attending another Rotary Club's meeting, participating in a club service project or visiting an e-Club.*
- Payment of annual membership dues
- Participation in activities or projects of the Rotary Club of Guilford both locally and internationally.
- Serving in leadership or committee roles
